### Bridge of Memory

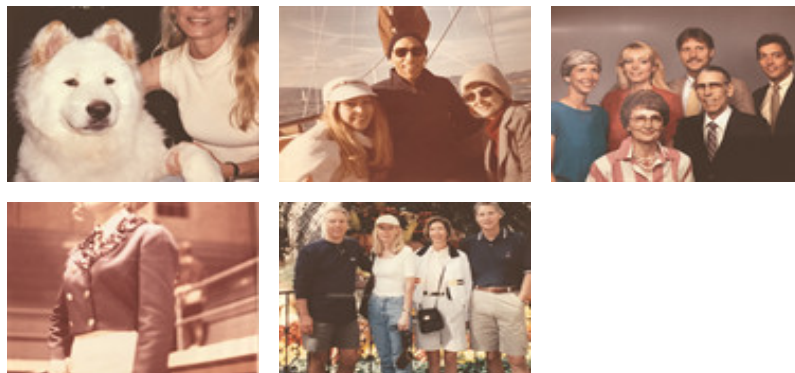
There is a bridge of memory. From earth to heaven above. It keeps you always near us, it's called the bridge of love. May you always walk in sunshine
