



Calvin Murton Bowman

February 19, 1934 - January 17, 2024

Calvin Murton Bowman passed away on January 17, 2024. He was born February 19, 1934, to Elmer S. Bowman and Elizabeth Leavitt in Logandale, Nevada, the youngest of eleven children.

Murton attended school in Logandale, Nevada, until 1946, when his family purchased the Manse Ranch in Pahrump, Nevada. He attended the one-room red schoolhouse there and later lived with his sister, Loretta Bowman, to attend school in Las Vegas. He graduated from Las Vegas High School in 1952.

Murton was drafted into the military and served with the military police in Salzburg, Austria, and California. After his military service, he attended Brigham Young University where he studied business and agriculture.

In 1957, he married Carole Carruth in the St. George L.D.S. Temple, and the young couple moved to Pahrump to join the family ranching business. In Pahrump they had 3 children, Anthony, Kirk and Alison. After moving to Las Vegas, their fourth child David was born. Murton continued ranching in Pahrump and established a printing company in Las Vegas. After retiring in 1998, Murton and Carole moved to Denver, Colorado, to be near their daughter and her young family for several years before returning to Las Vegas.

Murton was a member of the L.D.S. church and served in various ward callings. He especially enjoyed the five years that he worked with Carole in the Las Vegas Temple. He was grateful for his parent's ranching legacy in

Southern Nevada and their wonderful example of service to their community and the L.D.S. church.

He is survived by his sweet wife, four loving children, five grandchildren and three great grandsons. He is preceded in death by his parents, siblings, and his beloved grandson Cameron Bowman.

Funeral services will be at the Hillpointe L.D.S. Chapel (9011 Hillpointe Road) on Saturday, February 3, at 10:30 a.m., with a family viewing at 9:30 a.m.

Interment will be at the Logandale Cemetery later that afternoon at 2:30.
