March 24, 1934 - June 25, 2020

Elvira C. Remo, age 86, passed away at the Kindred Hospital in Las Vegas, NV on Thursday June 25, 2020. The daughter of Jose and Aurora Remo, Elvira was born on March 24, 1934 in Luzon City, Philippines. She graduated (BA) from the University of Santo Tomas in 1953 and Manila Central University (MD) in 1958 and moved to the United States in 1959 to work for the Brooklyn-Cumberland Medical Center (Brooklyn, NY) and begin her medical career in Pediatrics and Internal Medicine.

Elvira moved to Trenton, NJ in 1964 at the onset of a twenty year career as a Clinical Psychiatrist within the NJ Department of Health, State Psychiatric Hospital system (Trenton and Marlboro) as well as Emergency Room Physician in various hospitals in Mercer County, NJ. In 1982 she started an extended career as a Staff Physician with the Dept of Veterans Affairs Hospitals in Big Spring, TX, subsequently transferring to various locations throughout the US - including Lyons NJ, East Orange NJ, Lebanon PA, Los Angeles CA and Bakersfield, CA over a thirty year period ending in 2017. Concurrently, Elvira was an active member of the US Air Force Reserves for over twenty years achieving the rank of Lt. Colonel, prior to her retirement from the military in 2000.

Elvira had a unique zest for life, she tremendously enjoyed travel, music, food, her faith in Christ, and was always generous and loving to her friends and family. She is survived by her sisters Cora, Lilia and brother Efren, daughter Abigail, sons Eric and Noel, granddaughters Madison and Macy Oliver and

grandsons Kyler and Shane Remo. A private service will be held due to travel restrictions and uncertainty created by the COVID-19 pandemic.
