In the early morning hours of December 24, 2018 in Las Vegas, our beloved friend Jody passed on to her peaceful place, surrendering to the vicious disease of cancer.

Jody Lynne Jackman was the youngest of two children to parents Dr. Norman J. Jackman (deceased) and Joyce Rubin Jackman (deceased). She was born September 21, 1968 in Los Angeles, California and was an adventurous, competitive and driven child, qualities that lasted throughout her life and ultimately inspired her to take her disease on with strength, grace and determination. These qualities also allowed her to also help others fighting cancer to have faith, courage and strength.

On September 21, 2015, Jody was diagnosed with a very advanced stage of ovarian cancer, the same disease that her mother passed away from in November 1977. At the time of her diagnosis, Jody was a senior account executive and a client account manager at a major international corporation and was the number one producer at that time. Jody refused to let this disease beat her; instead, she challenged cancer head on, as she did with everything in her life - beating the ovarian cancer before having to deal with stomach cancer and finally succumbing to colon/intestinal cancer.

This born leader created the nonprofit foundation Jody Lynne Jackman in the hopes of helping those who, like she did, have the BRCA gene mutation or the possibility of having it. Her foundation hopes to get lab testing for the BRCA gene mutation in order to test and help those who have it make strong,

educated decisions. She was an expert in customer service, and she gave her 100% all the time. She was a truly generous and supportive friend to all she loved, and encouraging to all she met. Jody was loved by many friends and coworkers, and she leaves behind her true companion in life, Chip, her precious dog; she was ever so grateful that she had him to help her through her treatments and tough times.

Knowing she is exactly where she wants to be, at peace and finally able to exhale, she is loved and cherished, and forever missed.
