where he became an avid volunteer. He loved to volunteer at The Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada Thrift Store and at The Nellis AFB Hospital. In 1999, he was honored as the VA of Southern Nevada Healthcare System Volunteer of the Year. In addition, he received a plaque from the "Department of Veterans Affairs" in recognition of 7500 hours of dedicated volunteer service to veterans. In 2004, the Nevada Knights of Columbus named him Citizen of the Year "For Exemplary Service to Our Community". Joseph also volunteered many hours in several roles at Catholic Churches. In his free time, he walked frequently, enjoyed reading and did the crossword puzzle each day. His funeral Mass will be held at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic Church on February 9, 2024.
