Joyce Kasedy passed away March 3, 2018 at the age of 80. She was a life-long singer and entertainer known as Joy Brittain.

Born in Canada, Joyce began her career as a teenager on TV's "The Juliette Show" which aired across Canada. Later, she moved to Michigan, and then, upon obtaining a two-year contract at the Landmark Hotel and Casino, relocated to Las Vegas, NV. She continued to sing at various Casinos on the Strip but was proudest of her performance as lead singer for MGM's "Jubilee" both in Reno and Las Vegas. In later years, she gave back to the city that had made her famous by entertaining at various retirement facilities well into her 70's.

Proud of her Ukrainian heritage, Joyce not only spoke fluent Ukrainian, but also taught the art of painting Ukrainian eggs. She entertained at various Ukrainian festivals in the U.S. and Canada, and recorded an album entirely in Ukrainian.
