Lawrence Virgil Keever, 80, passed away peacefully on August 23rd, 2025. He was a devoted father, grandfather, son, brother, and coach whose presence touched many lives. He is preceded in death by his parents, Virgil and Dorris Keever, and his brother Rick Keever.

Larry's memory will be lovingly carried on by his wife, Lori; children Stephanie Louden and her husband Mike, son Paul, and daughter Camryn; stepchildren Nicole, Jordyn, and TJ Czyz; his ex-wife, Mary Keever; grandson, Lucas Louden; and brothers Dale Keever and Cliff Keever.

Born in Bellemont, Arizona, Larry's childhood was filled with adventure as his family moved often for his father's railroad work. Those early years sparked his love of travel and being on the open road. In high school, while living in Farmington, New Mexico, Larry became known for his athletic talent and passion for basketball.

After graduating, Larry made Las Vegas his lifelong home. He proudly served two years in Vietnam with the Army, and after returning, earned his degree from UNLV before beginning a long career in insurance. For 46 years, he dedicated himself to serving his clients and community with Washington National and later State Farm.

One of Larry's greatest joys was golf. After returning from the war, the game became a lifelong passion. He shared it with his daughters and remained a loyal supporter of the UNLV golf team and Rebel athletics.

A celebration of life for Larry will be held on Sunday, September 14th, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at Angel Park Golf Course. All who knew and loved him are welcome. The gathering will be casual, just as Larry would have wanted—filled with laughter, stories, and memories of “The Legend.”
