Ruth Louise Stackhouse passed away December 2, 2020 due to failing health at the age of 88. Ruth graduated from Cooley High School in Detroit in 1950. In her early adult years, Ruth was sought out for her fashion and singing skills, modeling at car shows and singing on local radio programs in the Detroit area. She began working at the Telephone Employees Credit Union of Detroit in the late 50s and in 1956 she met Tom Stackhouse, her husband-to-be. By the mid-60s, Tom and Ruth had moved to Altadena CA, but by 1968 they had decided on Las Vegas where Ruth would finish her financial career with Nevada Federal Credit Union in 1998, retiring as Assistant Vice President.
