They had good adopted families and were much loved. For that, I am happy.

Mom cried all my childhood, for her family- loved them deeply.

Edna was in hospital a long time, with severe pregnancy problems. The social worker told Grandma Edna they would have to take the children, until she returned home from the hospital. Grandma Edna parents had died and no one would temporary care for her children. Grandma Edna ended up not only losing the full-term baby but had also was claimed dead by the Dr. But, she recovered.

She got home and called social worker, who told her children had been adopted. She said she tried talking to lawyers etc, who told her it was too late. Nothing could be done.

Both Susan and Karen were adopted by the same court personel, when they had been to court, from the social worker- to become court wards.

Also, records burned in court fire. No way to find them,

Mom had found Johnny, but not her Sisters.

Mom loved playing with her brother and sisters.

Mom said Marguerite had long most beautiful black hair- like Mom had. She had a tiny waist,

Mom said her Grandmother Marguerite was beautiful, caring and loving.

She loved her homemade cinnamon rolls after being outside playing.

We loved Aunt Susan dearly and all our family. We are glad you all loved her too.

I am Maggie Marston. I was Susan's oldest child. I was born and adopted in Colorado in 1964. My birthday is May 15, 1964. Susan carried me to term in Denver CO. The name on my original birth certificate is Michelle Renee Choquette or Renee Michelle Choquette and my biological father was Frank Hummel, of Greeley CO. Susan said that she borrowed the name when she filled out the paperwork from an adopted uncle. I was adopted by Janet and Theodore Stuart. I was named Linda Sue Stuart and the adoption was finalized in Pueblo CO. I was married in 1989 to Matthew Lloyd Smedley and divorced several years later as Linda Sue Stuart-Smedley. Following the divorce I changed my whole name to one I liked. I picked the name Marston out of a phone book because it sounded French like Choquette and Roulier.

I found my blood mother Susan through adoption records via a Catholic Church site after many years of searching. Susan was living in Henderson, NV at the time, adjacent to Las Vegas. We exchanged letters. She shared the circumstances of her pregnancy and my birth, when she was 17. I appreciated being named in her obituary printed in Henderson, Nevada.

I currently live in Nevada. Thank you for posting this history. I really appreciate it. I was glad to correspond with my blood mother, and I am so glad she was loved. She spoke of her adoption and a few of the circumstances in Kansas but not of her mother's illness. She mentioned that their father had abandoned the family and that there had been much hardship during that time frame after WW II.

I worked as a career woman and worked as a botanist before retiring. I did not remarry or have children but I love animals, music and cinnamon rolls, too. I was very sad to hear of Susan's death.
